

## **Masters Report for NRC Meeting on April 15, 2019**

The members of the masters committee have written a questionnaire which has been piloted to the masters reps and will soon be rolled out to clubs.

### **Heads Races**

It was agreed that we need to remind the Sport Committee of the need to publish draw including whether handicaps will apply and publication of results for masters' handicap events, including raw time and time with handicaps applied.

*The following results need to be recorded:*

1. *Boat number – as decided by organizers, the fastest categories racing first and all similar categories racing at same time.*
2. *Overall order – fastest actual time first, slowest last*
3. *Crew name – Club or, perhaps stroke or sculler's name. Include masters category in brackets.*
4. *Category – boat type and if two or more mixed masters, i.e. F/G4x-*
5. *Start time – not vital except on Tideway*
6. *Finish time - not vital except on Tideway*
7. *Actual race time*
8. *Masters handicap (seconds)*
9. *Adjusted time*
10. *Category order – based on adjusted time*

The ability to report race results promptly is important, including handicaps, this appears to be linked to the software in use. Race clocker appears to be very effective and relatively inexpensive.

**BR National Masters Regatta 2019** will be at Strathclyde Park on 15th/16th June.

Chris Anton reported as follows:

1. Entries will open on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> April and will be open until 2nd June
2. Prices are the same as last year - parking in SCP is free
3. Mixed 4+ has been added.
4. 2 levels of non-champ - intermediate for those who have not won an event previously at Masters or Scottish Champs; and beginner for those who started rowing since 1/6/17.
5. Events will be on the same days as last year, namely:

Saturday – championship sculling and non-championship sweep events

Sunday – championship sweep and non-championship sculling events

The list of previous winners will be published within the next week.
