## Regional roles and responsibilities of the NCC Representatives

Due to the restructure of the E+T Team the role and responsibilities of the regional NCC representative has changed

- Represent your region at three National Coaching Committee meetings to be held annually in September, December and March; and if not able to be present to arrange for a deputy to attend.
- Ensure there is an effective two way communication channel between the committee and your region, feeding back their region's requirements to inform future strategies and supporting programme development.
- Initiate and chair a minimum of one regional coach education meeting every year involving all coach educators and the region's BR appointed Internal Quality Assuror (formerly known as the Internal Verifier). This meeting is a QA requirement for the UKCC standards. A key outcome of this meeting should be that there is an agreed rolling 18 month coach education programme that can be sent into the BR Education & Training team for inclusion on the web and to help plan the annual workshop programme. Minutes of this meeting must be sent to the IQA Team Leader.
- Each year advise the BR Head of Education and Training, of two or three regional events (races or regional conferences), where a member of staff from across the British Rowing Directorates could attend to seek feedback from the rowing community and promote British Rowing activities, including education and training opportunities.

- Work alongside BR Staff and the Regional Rowing Council Secretary to develop a regional coaching network.
- Ensure the Education and Training Team Administrator has a current list of suitable venues for the workshop programme and help secure required equipment where necessary by liaising with clubs.
- With the regional IQA, consider any gaps or succession planning needed in your coach educator regional team and liaise with the Head of Education and Training to recruit educators.
- Promote forthcoming conferences, workshops, opportunities and awards to the regional community.
- Represent their region's coaching community at their regional council meetings
